Road Safety in Ashton



Ashton Parish Council is concerned about road safety in Ashton. The speed of traffic in the village is clearly a major factor. Community Speed Watch has a part to play to both monitor and reduce traffic speed in the village.

Ashton has been selected to take part in Community Speed Watch in 2010. The project works by pairing up villages that will rotate the speed monitoring equipment between themselves on a weekly basis over a period of six weeks.

Ashton has been paired with Hartwell between the period of 4th April and 16th May 2010. We will have the use of the equipment on the 2nd, 4th and 6th weeks of the above period.

All volunteers must attend a training session before they can become involved with the project for reasons of Health, Safety and Insurance purposes (those not trained will not be covered by insurance). Refresher training will also be made available to all volunteers who have undergone training previously. This will give them the opportunity to exchange experiences and comments and also allow them to be brought up to date with the latest training. A training session will also be arranged for all new villagers entering the scheme. Their details have been passed onto PC John McQuaid who will be in contact in advance of their participation, to provide a training date and directions to the venue. Training sessions take place at Brackmills, Northampton on Saturday morning (10.00 hrs - 12.30 hrs)
