County Launch for CLARENCE 0800 232323

CLARENCE is a new computerised fault reporting system for members of the public to report highway faults such as damaged pavements, potholes, failed traffic lights, blocked drains and broken street lights. Open between 9 am and 5 pm Mondays to Fridays CLARENCE operators will log details of the fault and give callers a unique reference number so that they can find out what action has been or will be taken on their report. With one freephone number the problem of who to contact to report a fault or hazard on the highway is solved.
