Ashton Parish Council Meeting

Points from the meeting held on 13 January:-

Road Gritting through Ashton will be done at no cost to the village. Gritting will only be done in severe conditions.

2 street lights in St Michael's Court are to be removed.

The **Fireworks** evening was wet but well supported. A total of £307 was made for School funds.

South Northants Council representatives are reluctant to attend further meetings as they believe they have answered all outstanding queries concerning the **Compost Scheme**.

Urgent work on drains will be carried out soon.

The village sign on Roade Hill is obscured by hedging which is to be trimmed in the near future.

Discussions were held concerning the frequency and cost of mowing the **Playing Field** behind the pub.

The Council is to apply for a **Precept** of £3000. This is the same amount as last year, as no additional expenses are forecast for the coming year.

Funds could be available for **Millenium Celebrations**. Ideas for celebrations in Ashton are needed urgently.

A letter has been sent to SNDC requesting Traffic Calming in the village.

A resident complained about the messy state of **leaves on the road** at Roade Hill. The council discussed plans to deal with this problem for the coming Autumn.

Tree database forms have been forwarded to David Hearth, Tree Warden.

The **Footpath** wardens informed the Council that a survey was carried out at the end of 1997. New finger posts have already been erected.

Next meeting is March 10 at 7.30 pm in the Old Crown.
